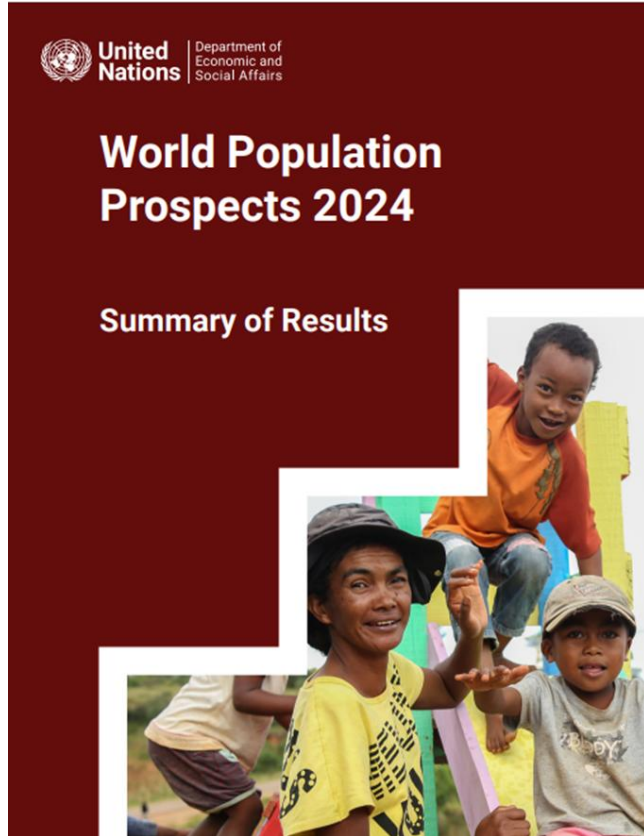

- The world's population is likely to peak within the current century.
- Declining birth rate
- Progression of aging.

The large youth population and an aging society coexist in an unprecedented manner.



Population Growth and Urban Development

- As per UN, 55% of the world's population currently lives in urban areas, and this figure is projected to rise to 68% by 2050.
- This means approximately 2.5 billion people will be added to urban populations by the middle of the century.
- Almost 90% of the population increase will take place in Asia and Africa.

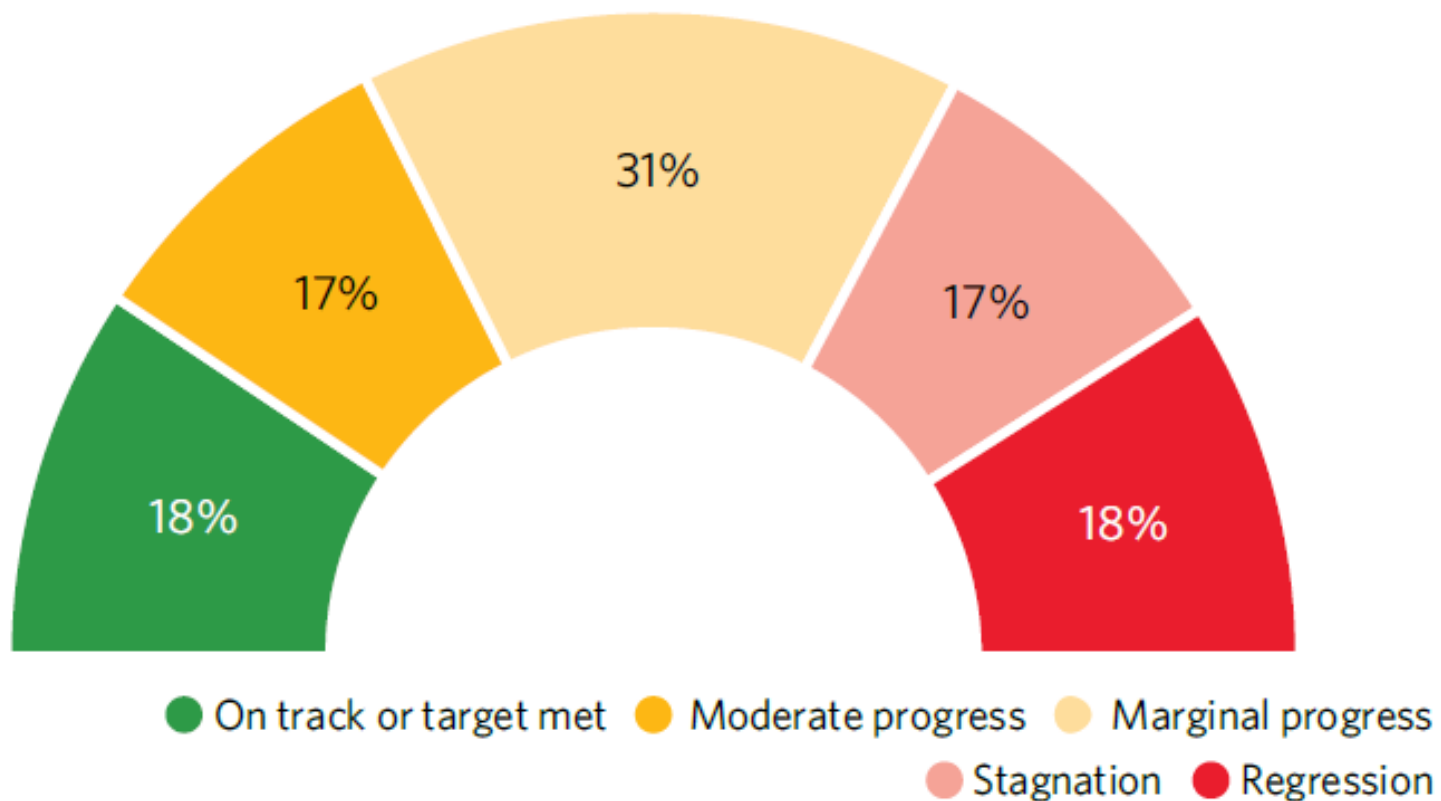


Urbanization in Asia and Africa

- By 2030, the world is projected to have 43 megacities with more than 10 million inhabitants, most of them in developing regions.
- Almost 90 % of urban expansion in the next decades will take place in the developing countries.
- **By 2050, the urban population in Asia is expected to grow by 50% - an additional 1.2 billion people.**
- However, some of the fastest-growing urban agglomerations are cities with fewer than 1 million inhabitants, many of them located in Asia and Africa.

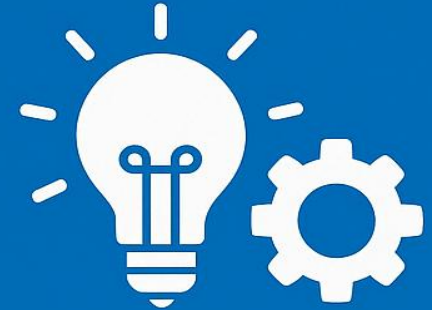

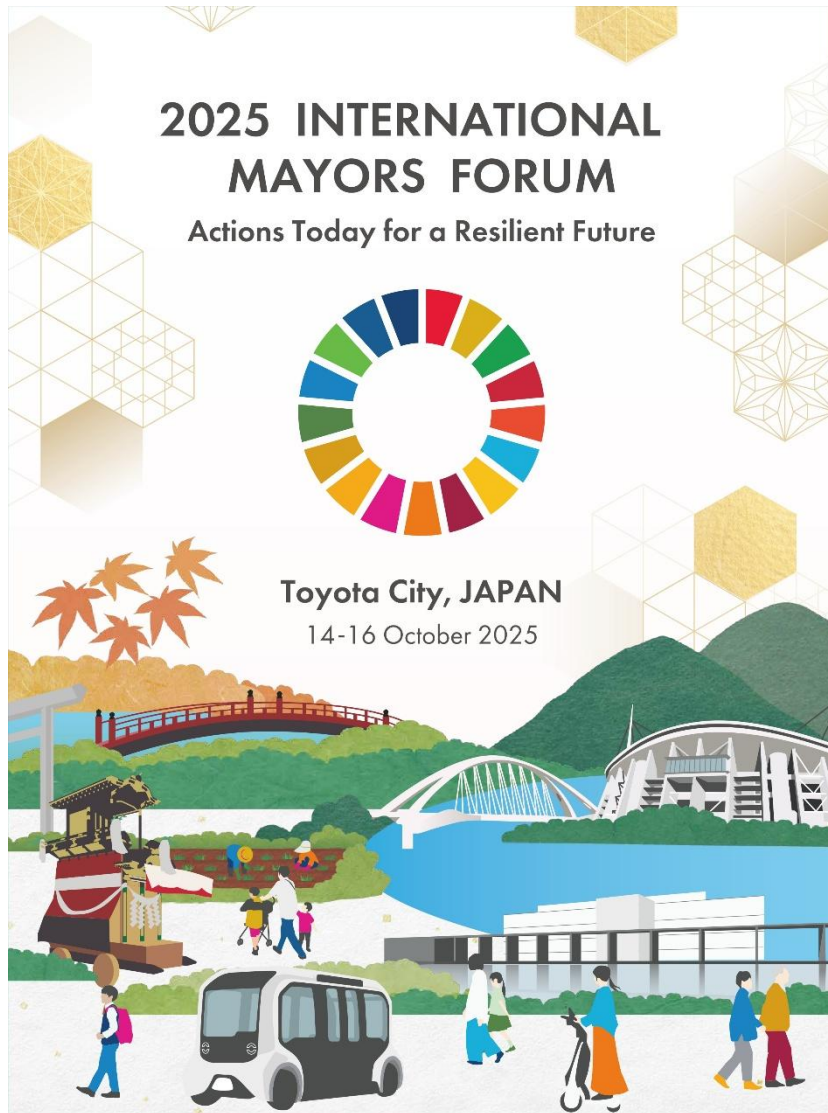

2025 International Mayors Forum



2025 International Mayors Forum (14-16 October 2025, Toyota City, Japan)

Organized by UN DESA with support from UNCRD and UNOSD, together with UN-Habitat and the City of Toyota, the forum promotes knowledge sharing, partnerships, and local actions for resilient, inclusive, and sustainable cities toward 2030.

It brought together 289 participants from 68 cities in 38 countries and adopted the Toyota Action Plan for Partnerships as its output.

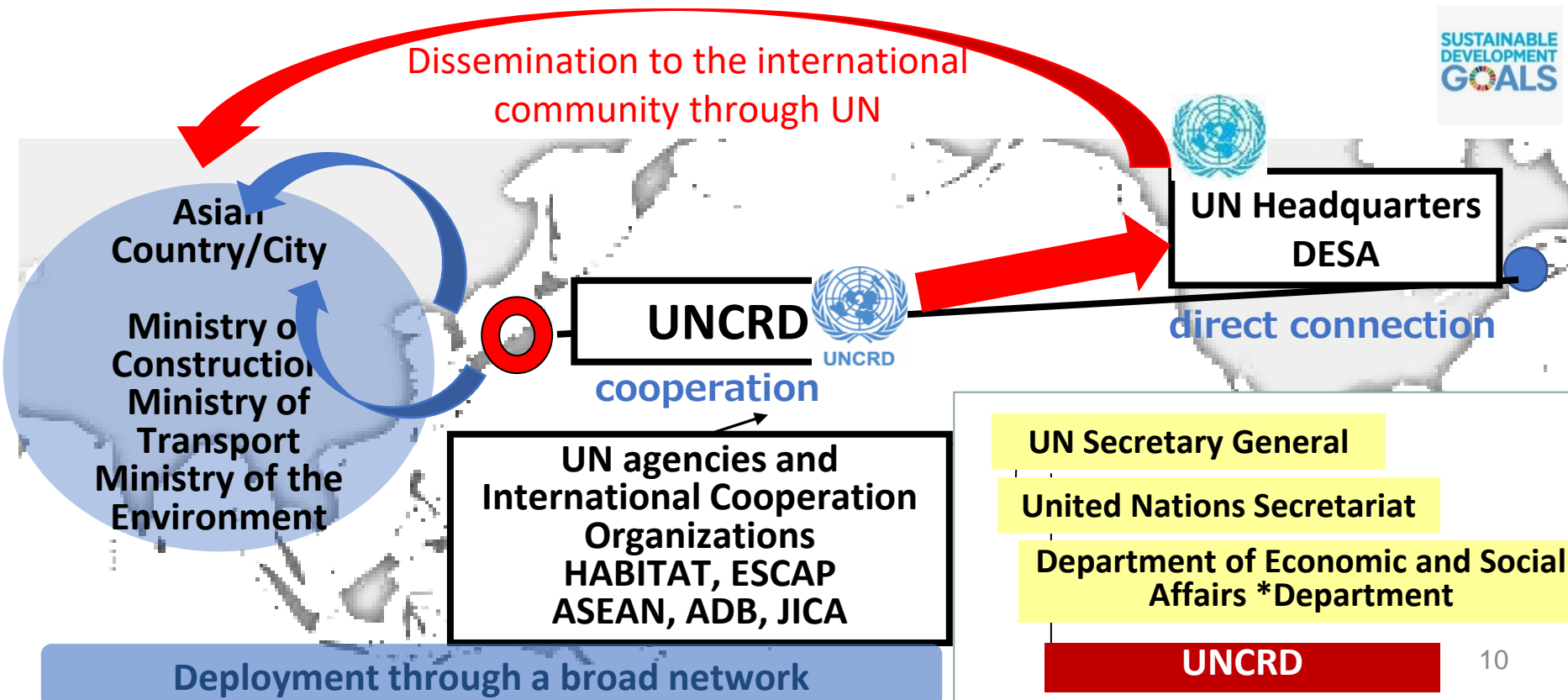

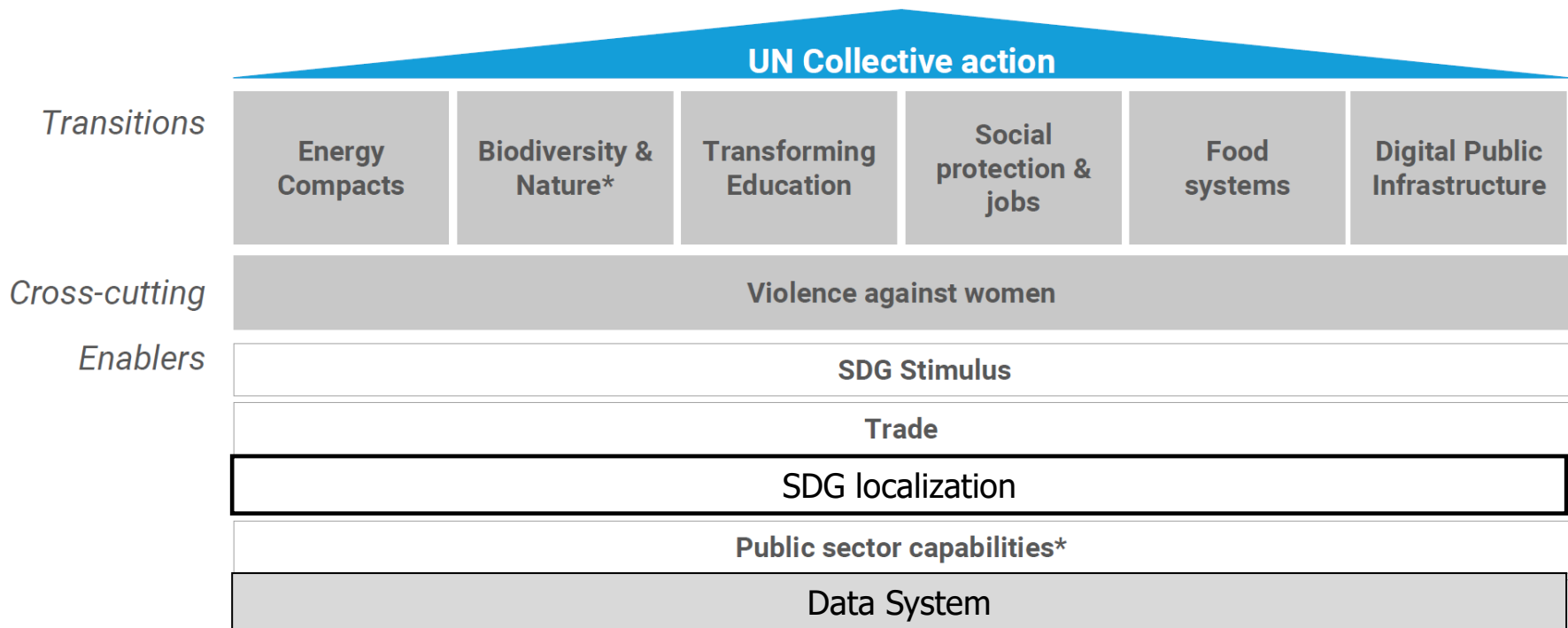
Introduction to UNCRD
