

Social Institution & Gender Index (2023)


8 countries in ASEAN and Japan are scored as more discriminatory than the world average regarding discrimination in the family.

Medium wage by the degree of job's link to the environment




Digital divide matters for inclusive disaster management


Income level, education level, gender, location etc determines the digital divide.

By income level







By education level
