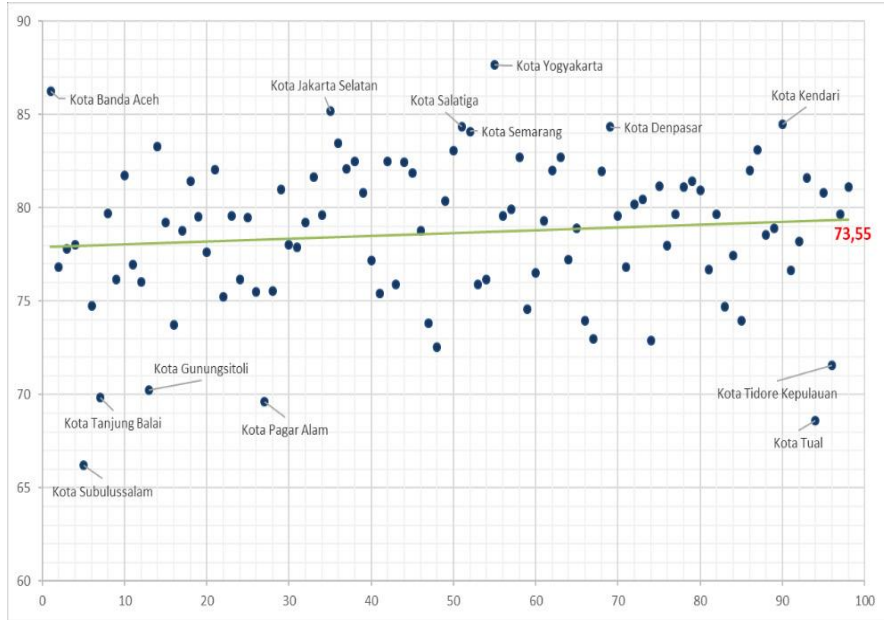

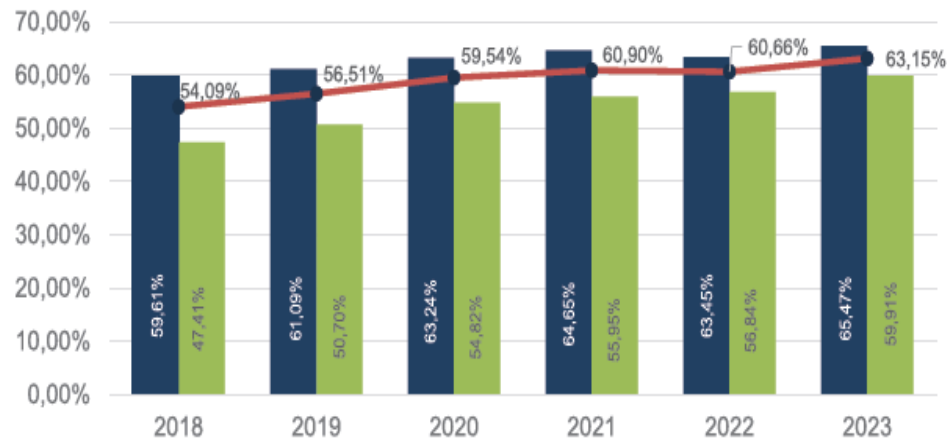

Percentage of Household Access to Decent Housing (RLH) in 2018-2023



In 2024, **92.64%** of households had access to improved drinking water, while **80.29%** of households had access to improved sanitation in 2021. Despite the improvements, challenges such as **disparities in access between regions and water pollution persist**.



Data shows an **increase in urban transportation services in Indonesia**. In October 2025, MRT usage increased to an index of 111, KRL (92), and Transjakarta (89). In January 2024 showed a **significant increase in the number of MRT passengers** (23.76%) y-o-y), **LRT** (33.71%) y-o-y), and **Transjakarta** (54.66%) y-o-y).

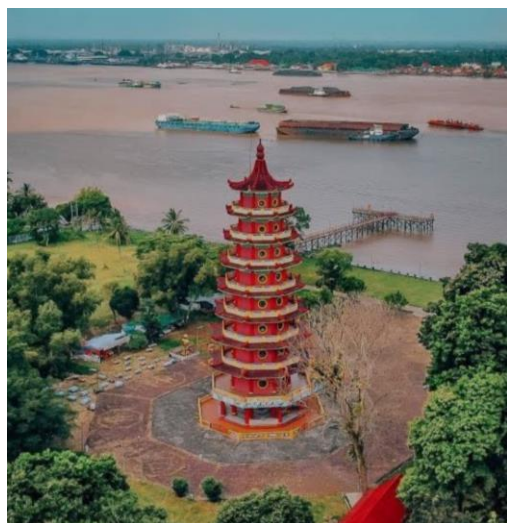
